DISCUSS

Read 1 Peter 3:8-12

- Verses 8–9 give us a list of things we should and shouldn't do as believers. Which of these do you find easy to live out? Which are more challenging?
- Our words carry weight. Where else in Scripture do we see teaching on the power of words?
- Verse 11 calls us to seek peace and pursue it. What are some tangible ways you can keep peace in your relationships and in your church community?
- Verse 12 describes the Lord's eyes and ears toward the righteous. What does this verse reveal about God's character?

Read 1 Peter 3:13-17

- Verse 14 reminds us that suffering can come with an eternal reward. When you think of God rewarding faithfulness through trials, what rewards come to mind? (Examples: deeper faith, eternal life, future glory...)
- Peter challenges us to always be prepared to share our story. Do you feel equipped to tell your story of faith if someone asked? Why or why not?
- Verse 16 says our conduct should show gentleness and respect. How do our words and actions impact the way unbelievers view the gospel?

Read 1 Peter 3:18-22

- This passage shows baptism as a sign pointing to Jesus and His saving work, not anything we've done. How does this truth deepen your understanding of salvation?
- Water shows up in scripture as both judgment and grace (the flood, the Red Sea, etc.). How does baptism point to both themes?
- How does seeing someone baptized encourage unity and strengthen our faith as a church family?

TAKE ACTION

Share your story: Take five minutes this week to share what God has done in your life with someone. It could be a friend, coworker, or family member. (You can structure it like the following: your life before you knew Jesus, meeting Jesus and choosing to follow him, and the differences you now experience by knowing him).
