**need to know:** God is King of all Kings

**bible reference:** 1 Timothy 6:15, Revelation 1:4-5

## circle up

*Use this time to gather together and get everyone talking. Let your kids know that this is safe place for them to share their feelings, emotions and questions.*



- For your elementary-aged kids, ask them about the best part of their week. Allow space for them to share a hard part of their week if they would like. For your preschool-aged kids, have them draw something fun from their week.
- **ASK: If you were a king or a queen, what would your crown look like?** Allow your preschoolers to draw a picture if they would like to.

## watch

ASK your Elementary Schooler:

- **What makes God different than any other king?**
- **What are some of your favorite things about God? Do you think these things make Him a good king?**
- **Would you like God to be the King of your heart and life?** (Check out this resource to help you walk through salvation conversations with your child if they answer yes to this question: [Faith Commitment and Baptism Workbook](#). Also be sure to check out this [website](#).)

ASK your Preschooler:

- **Did King Asa love God?** (yes)
- **Can we be kind to others by eating ice cream or by telling them about God's love?** (Telling them about God's love)
- **If you can be kind to others, let me see you jump up as high as you can!**



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## have fun together

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*From playing to praying together, have fun learning more about God!*

- Take some time to pray together as a family. Pray that each person would recognize that God is the King of all Kings. Allow your kids to share any prayer requests that they might have and allow your elementary kids to pray out loud if they would like to.
- Allow your kids to create something to show honor to God since He is the King of all kings! They could draw a picture, make a craft, sing a song, write a poem, do a dance, bake a treat, etc. Help them brainstorm ideas and then assist them as needed to complete whatever they choose.
