Use this time to gather and get everyone talking. Let your kids know that this is safe place for them to share their feelings, emotions, and questions.



- For your elementary-aged kids, ask them about the best part of their week. Allow space for them to share a hard part of their week if they would like. For your preschool-aged kids, have them draw something fun from their week.
- ASK: If you were the king or queen of a kingdom and could declare that everyone eats your favorite food, what would that be? Would you make up any special holidays for your kingdom? What would they be?
