## **SERMON STUDY**

Read these verses before you begin your discussion: Matthew 28:18-20, Isaiah 43:19, John 1:35-46

Dive deeper into this week's message and passage from the Bible. Here are some questions to help you guide your group discussion.

As a church, and as individuals, we want to be the kind of followers of Jesus who are married to our mission instead of our methods. Have you ever confused the two—in your personal life or in your spiritual life? What methods have you had to change over time, or do you currently need to change in order to stay on mission with God?

God can do amazing things through average people if they give him full access to their lives. Have you ever considered that God wants to do amazing things through your life? How have you seen God use average people—including yourself!—in ways that have surprised or humbled you?

Jesus' disciples started following him not because they had all of their questions answered or because they had everything figured out, but because they accepted a personal invitation to start following him. Like the disciples, our spiritual growth is essential so we can help people get to Jesus. The purpose of Jesus is the purpose of our church. Who do you need to extend a personal invitation to "come and see" this week?
